SYNOPSIS

Mira, in her early 20s, escapes from the pressure of running her family's vineyard by playing ice hockey. When new player Theresa joins the team, she challenges Mira's rigid worldview, leading to life-changing nights on the streets of Vienna.



DIRECTORS' STATEMENT

In films, I like stories and characters that unfold bit by bit, gradually revealing their world(s), with all their flaws, desires and facets.

Like all of us, Mira, the main character, does not have just one role to play in life: Mira is a professional ice hockey player and the captain of the team Dragons; Mira is a winegrower and works in the family business together with her mother and her grandfather, who is increasingly suffering from dementia.

Mira responds to the daily challenges of life by being tough on herself, being disciplined and not allowing herself any emotions. Mira doesn't have a world of her own, she hardly feels her loneliness, because she is too busy to live up to other people's expectations.

But things change when Theresa joins the team. And life changes when Mira's brother shows up and becomes part of her life again. Suddenly Mira's life is filled with light, colours, an exciting nightlife and new (gender) roles. In Mira's vigorous search for herself, things might and must break.

Breaking the Ice is an emotional story told in dynamic pictures: movements, contrasts, colours. Liberating adventures at night; the fast-paced, hard sport on the ice; the cold and the wind when Mira works in the vineyard.

My film is about taking control over one's own life. About enjoying life and letting loose, being true to oneself and letting go of other people's expectations. It's also about family and the speechlessness within the family. And the close ties that are there in a family, regardless. It's about team spirit and solidarity. It's about how we want to live together.

It's about equality. In life and in sports. It's about playing with and breaking up gender roles.

It's about recognising and admitting love. And maybe letting it go again.

What do we need to break the ice? To have the courage to make us vulnerable and to be ourselves? What does it take for us to have the confidence to trust?







PRODUCER'S NOTE

We are always looking for directors with a signature style, who view the world with true interest and respect. And so Clara Stern's short film MATHIAS impressed us with its bold narrative and resolute images. That's why we were keen on producing her first feature-length film.

BREAKING THE ICE gives its characters a lot of room to develop and is full of faith in community, tolerance and courage. Clara sends her main character Mira on a journey of family conflicts and combative ice hockey matches until she recognises her own possibilities. CLARA STERN BIOGRAPHY

Screenwriter, Director; Born 1987 in Vienna, Austria.

To look at movies only from a theoretical point of view (Theatre, Film and Media Studies in Vienna and Utrecht, Netherlands) was at some point not enough, not anymore. In order to learn how to tell stories on my own I studied at the Film Academy Vienna, first Screenwriting (with Professor Götz Spielmann), then after two years applied again, this time for Directing (with professors Wolfgang Murnberger and Michael Haneke). Finished both.



After several short films, BREAKING THE ICE is my first feature film. I want to make movies that entertain and move emotionally, shake you up and leave you yearning. I focus on feminist topics as well as on socio-critical and -political topics.

ALINA SCHALLER BIOGRAPHY

Alina Schaller is an Austrian actress, born 1997 in Vienna. She started her acting career at the age of eight. Since then she was part of several Austrian and German film productions and stood on the stage of various theaters in Austria. In 2017, she made her film debut in the short film "Voltage", which premiered at the Berlinale Film Festival. She was also part of one of the most successful Austrian TV-series: "Vorstadtweiber", the Austrian equivalent to "Desperate Housewives". Alina is also a dancer, journalist and runs the performative theater group "kollekTief" - after the first lockdown 2020 she was part of a performance where the group isolated itself in glass boxes for 14 days. In 2017 she was the youngest person to ever be nominated for the Austrian Theater Award "Nestroy", she was also nominated for the Austrian TV-Award "Romy" in 2020. Mira in BREAKING THE ICE is her first leading role in a feature film, celebrating its premiere at the Tribeca Film Festival.

JUDITH ALTENBERGER BIOGRAPHY

Judith Altenberger, born in 1996, is an Austrian actress. She started her career at various small off-theatre groups in Austria and Switzerland. Later she studied Theatre, Film and Media Studies and Sociology at the University of Vienna and took part in several stage design classes. At the same time, she contributed to different short films as an actress and producer. She became interested in music at a very early age and plays various instruments such as saxophone, transverse flute and guitar, and founded the hammered dulcimer band "HANV", of which she is also a part. In addition to her music career, she competed as a show jumper and gymnast for years, won the state championship with her team several times, until an injury ended her active career as an athlete. Now she is making her debut as an ice hockey player with her first feature film BREAKING THE ICE at the Tribeca film festival.
